# 1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

# 1.1 INTRODUCTION

Govt. R.R.M. P.G. College Surajpur, an institution devoted to meet the needs of higher education in the Surajpur district has attained great heights in the past few years.

Surajpur district was established in 2012. It is 40 km away from divisional headquarter Ambikapur. It is well connected by rail and road. The railway station is known as Surajpur Road. Railway route is Anuppur-Ambikapur branch line.

The college is situated in the tribal belt and majority of students come from tribal and other backward classes. The prime aim of the college is to propagate knowledge to the students in the socially and economically challenged area with the motto "Mother and Motherland are Superior to Heaven". The number of students in higher education has been on a constant rise, therefore our responsibility has increased. The college was established in 1984. It has Post Graduation in 7 subjects with PGDCA & DCA affiliated to Sant Gahira Guru Vishwavidyalaya, Ambikapur (C.G.). The total strength of the students is around 1516. The college has distinguished faculty, with its commitment to develop a fully equipped centre of learning. The college has established a strong infrastructure: building, library facilities, and a well-managed girls hostel. The green campus has facilitated a calm and peaceful atmosphere for the teaching and learning process. It is a renowned centre for higher learning in the Surajpur region and in the first Cycle of Accreditation Process (5 Nov 2016), with "B" Grade by the NAAC, first among all the colleges in the Surajpur district. The college is PG College since 2017. The Self Study Report (SSR) of Govt. R.R.M. P.G. College Surajpur has been prepared, keeping in view all the seven core values advocated by the NAAC. While preparing the report, care has been taken to reflect objectivity, self-analysis, reflection and professionalism of the college. Basically, it has been a great learning experience for the stakeholders of the college.

- Infrastructure: The college has well constructed buildings with 3 ICT smart classrooms for effective teaching-learning activities, ample playing fields, parking slots, cricket stadium, Girls hostel, Girls common room, multipurpose hall, Child day care and first aid room, facilities for divyangjan etc. are some of our strengths. Computers with other accessories and internet facilities are available in the PG departments.
- Safe and Secured campus: The entire college campus is safe and secured with CCTV cameras. CCTV cameras are also installed in the class rooms, laboratory, office and veranda.
- Talented faculty and efficient support staff: highly qualified, motivated, and professionally strong faculty, some of them with national and internationally recognized teaching and research experience. Excellent capability of non-teaching/ administrative staff to adopt new trends and deliver at any point in time.
- College Library: A treasure equipped with a sufficient no. of books, national and international journal subscriptions, access to NLIST/INFLIBNET, and digitization with internet connectivity. A Reading Room facility for students is also available in the library. Separate library is also available for each PG department.
- Laboratory facility: A well-established laboratory available in Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physics and Computer Science departments.
- A Hub for Diverse Student Base with other facility beyond Curriculum: a pool of student community with academic excellence, extracurricular activities, and sports competitions, etc. like vast sports infrastructure with multiple sports facilities, Motivated and dedicated volunteers of National Service Scheme (NSS), Red Ribbon Club, Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat, Career Counselling and Placement Cell, registered alumni cell, Effective Grievances redressal mechanism, etc.
- The college is situated in a tribal region and the atmosphere is green, very calm and quiet making it congenial for study.
- The college has 6 UG and 7 PG programs. PG programs run in Chemistry, Botany, Commerce, Hindi, Political Science, Economics and Sociology.
- The College has oxyzone and a prototype aquatic pond for ecological studies. Birds nests are also installed for birds' life protection.
- The student help desk is also available with a few stationary items and photocopies facility available for students.
- The solid and liquid waste of college is collected by Nagar palika to maintain the college campus neat and clean.
- The college is a registered research center of Sant Gahira Guru Viswavidyalaya Surguja, Ambikapur, for Chemistry, Botany, Commerce, Hindi, Political Science, Economics and Sociology.

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- Open and indoor stadium and Gymnasium with all facilities.
- Regular feedback obtained and analyzed.
- MoU and Collaboration with other institutes.

### **Institutional Weakness**

- The sanctioned posts of Professor is vacant in PG departments.
- Teacher and student ratio is low.
- The post of regular Lab attendant is vacant in the laboratory.
- No transportation facility for students coming from rural areas.
- Limited research atmosphere is available as less opportunity for faculty to access entrepreneurial training to transform laboratory research into commercial exploitation and R&D collaborations. Research facilities in the college are still in the infancy stage.
- Inadequate campus placement due to poor availability of the corporate sector in this rural tribal region.

- To Improve the facility for Research as 7 PG departments have been recognized as research centers from affiliating university.
- To develop Consultancy services to provide the expertise of faculties to society.
- Collaborative Activities to enhance academic opportunities.
- Availability of PG courses in various subjects in surrounding 40 KM areas is a big opportunity for graduates.
- PG students are motivated to go for research and to qualify various competitive exams like CSIR-UGC NET, GATE, SET, etc.
- To install Incubation Centre to promote ideas of business and research coming from the students
- Scope for developing Interdisciplinary Research & Teaching.
- To train students to face the challenges ahead of them to bring them to the mainstream.
- Scope for Alumni involvement in college development.
- To start an English lab to enhance the communication skill of students.
- To develop full-fledged courses based on industry needs and skill development.
- Enhancing the sports infrastructure with state-of-the-art indoor and outdoor stadiums.

# 1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

# **Curricular Aspects**

The college is under Higher Education Department (HED), Government of Chhattisgarh, Raipur and is affiliated to Sant Gahira Guru Vishwavidyalaya, Ambikapur. The college follows the undergraduate syllabus designed by Central Board of Studies, HED, Raipur and PG programs syllabus (CBCS mode) is provided by the university. The college adopts the academic calendar of the higher education department of Chhattisgarh government. In every academic year an Internal Evaluation Committee is constituted for the continuous internal evaluation (CIE). Student induction program is conducted for the newly admitted students. All the faculty members prepare teaching plans and maintain the daily diary. The college organizes internal examinations like unit tests, quarterly and half yearly examinations. Each PG department organizes departmental seminars, group discussions and educational tours. Regular meetings of the department with the principal are held to monitor effective curriculum delivery. College has a sufficient number of classrooms, well-equipped laboratories, ICT rooms, LAN & Wi-Fi connectivity. To strengthen the curricular delivery system webinar, seminar and guest lectures are organized. All science departments have constituted KECs (Knowledge Enrichment Circle) for advanced learners. The regular faculties of college complete their induction program, refresher course and faculty development programs. Faculty of the college are working as members in several committees of the college and university. Teachers of the college participate in academic council, BoS, Setting of question papers for UG/PG programs, Assessment/evaluation process, design and development of curriculum of the affiliating University. The university integrates cross-cutting issues relevant to Gender, Environment and Sustainability, Human Values and Professional Ethics into the curriculum. In the first year undergraduate program, environmental studies paper is compulsory. Research methodology, social outreach and skill development, intellectual property rights and dissertation papers are compulsory for semester programs. The college organizes various programs such as Women's Health and hygiene, Personality Development, Self-protection, Yoga training etc. College also organizes various extension activities through NSS, Ek Bharat- Shreshtha Bharat and Red Ribbon club to inculcate human values and professional Ethics. Regular feedback is taken from teachers, students, parents, staff and alumni on the curriculum delivery and follow up action is taken after the analyzing the feedback.

## **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

The college is committed to improve student's ability by providing quality education. The college adopts student centric methods of teaching-learning and co-curricular activities. The college exhibits an efficient mechanism to ensure a transparent and efficient assessment and evaluation process. All faculty members prepare the teaching plan before the beginning of classes for effective teaching. The college practices various student's centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies for enriching learning experiences. The college regularly assesses learning levels of advanced and slow learners through unit tests, CCA, end-semester exam, assignments, presentations, viva-voce exam for

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PG students and unit tests and half yearly exam for UG students. Advanced learners are encouraged for in depth reading and participate in co-curricular activities such as class discussion and presentations for UG and PG students. The KECs is implemented in all science departments for advance learners. The university syllabus includes project work, field-work, seminars, dissertation and social outreach programs. All faculty members use ICT tools like digital writing pad, PPT, desktop, laptops, smart mobile, webcam, speaker, audio-videolectures, OHP, virtual labs, YouTube link to impart effective teaching and learning. The college is well equipped with three ICT rooms with smart classrooms. All the faculties use Google classroom, Google meet, Zoom, Teachmint and HECG online app as online teaching platforms. The college is an active member of INFLIBNET services providing e-books, e-journals, e-magazines and e-contents. The college is equipped with 45 computers for academic and 6 for administrative purposes. The internal evaluation includes unit test, half yearly, terminal exam for UG students and unit test, CCA tests, seminars, social outreach activities for PG students under CBCS pattern. The evaluated answer copies and model answers are shown and discussed with the students. The marks obtained by the students in internal assessment are recorded periodically in the register by the concerned department. The annual and semester examination answer copies are evaluated by the university and the grievances raised by the students are resolved by revaluation process of answer copies and retotaling of marks. All meritorious students are felicitated with prizes and certificates during the college annual function.

## Research, Innovations and Extension

The college has created an ecosystem for research, innovations and extension. All PG departments are recognized as research centers by the university. Two faculties (chemistry and zoology) are research guides. All PG students participate in project works, social outreach & skill development, dissertation for research approach. The department of chemistry organized a 05 days international workshop on experimental techniques. The college has a well-equipped science laboratories and about 1200 books for academic and research purposes. Five faculties are registered for Ph.D. programs. The college has one MoU with CIPET, Korba and one institutional collaboration with Shivnath Science College, Rajnandgaon (C.G.) for the promotion of academic, training and research activities. Faculty members completed orientation/induction program, refresher course, faculty development programs and participated in several national and international conferences, seminars, webinars, workshops. Different committees and departments organize webinars, guest lectures and workshops. Interdisciplinary minor research project on social problems has jointly started funded by the college Janbhagidari Samiti. Two research papers have been published by the chemistry and zoology faculty. Under innovative activity, zoology students are trained to preserve naturally dead animals, collect local insects to prepare insect boxes and maintain aquariums. Botany students collect local seed varieties for preparation of departmental gene bank and the department has developed an artificial small pond in the college campus for ecology and environmental research. The university syllabus has a compulsory paper of Research methodology for research promotion. Career Guidance & Placement cell runs twitter account with ID @PgGovt for latest update. For extension activities, the college works with NSS, Ek Bharat-Shrestha Bharat, Systematic Voters Education and Electoral Participation (SVEEP), Red Ribbon Club and different college committees to develop the spirit of social services. NSS works for plantation, cleanliness drive, AIDS awareness, health checkup, distribution of mask, sanitizer, several social awareness programs etc., SVEEP activities for voter awareness, Fit-India movement for yoga and health awareness, legal literacy for gender sensitization, Red Ribbon Club for blood donation awareness and Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat for interstate cultural and social activities. College organizes annual functions, different events, sports and cultural activities, summer internships etc. throughout the year.

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### **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

The college is situated at Navapara, Surajpur acquiring 10.56 Hectare of land area and has adequate infrastructure facilities for teaching and learning. The college buildings and girls hostel is equipped with CCTV cameras and fire extinguishers. The college campus has a garden surrounded by a boundary wall. The college also has bore wells and RO system for drinking water. The college building has a proper electricity facility with energy saving electrical equipments. The college premises have a bicycle and motor vehicle stand. The college has notice boards, complaint boxes and "Thought of the day" boards. The college has an old building with 17 rooms having a principal room, office room, account section, seminar hall, NSS room, girls common room, toilets, class rooms, arts and commerce departments. The New RUSA building has 20 rooms with partitions having examination control room, smart classrooms with ICT facility, classrooms, science departments, girls common room, laboratories, toilets and veranda for use for science laboratory purposes. There are five laboratories in the college in which experimental learning is going on in a proper way. There is a laboratory for Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physics, and the computer department. There are sufficient instruments and experimental materials available in the laboratories. All teaching staff members use the ICT in the smart classrooms. The college has a well-furnished library automated with KOHA software. The college uses subscribed N-list, Inflibnet with journals, e-journals, e-books, e- magazines, e-ShodhSindhu, Shodhganga membership etc. All PG Departments have their own departmental library. The college has several facilities like projector set, computers, photocopy, scanner, printer, refrigerators, TV, CCTVs, general repairing and gardening equipments etc. Currently IsolNet has laid down in the college for internet and wi-fi connectivity. The computers are maintained by the recognized firms to ensure maximum utilization of these computers. The Institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, yoga center, stadium, games (indoor & outdoor), gymnasium and cycle stand. The college organizes cultural activities such as solo dance, group dance, solo song, group song, drawing, debate, fancy dress, rangoli, painting, mehndi, quiz, poster making, essay writing, slogan writing, sangeet and drama preparation etc.

# **Student Support and Progression**

The college believes in youth empowerment through active participation of students at college, university, district and state level in various co-curricular activities. The students are benefited by scholarships provided by the state Government. The Student Union is constituted by the college as per the instructions of Higher Education Department, Raipur. The student's representatives encourage other students to participate in several events and also encourage them to maintain a green and plastic-free campus by following the rules and regulations of the college. The NSS volunteers along with the student representatives organize several activities like sports, cultural events, social and plantation drives. The 'Blue Brigade' along with NSS volunteers supports local villagers and families of urban areas for immunization, health, nutrition, sanitation and learning of childrens. The college also has EK Bharat-Shrestha Bharat (EBSB) unit pairing with Govt. Arts and Commerce college Kachhal, Gujarat. Red Ribbon Club organizes campaigns through rallies, poster presentations, enacting plays, debates and group discussions for AIDS awareness among the local residents and student community. The college develops capacity building and skills enhancement initiatives like soft skills, communication skills, yoga, physical fitness, health and hygiene. The college also promotes placement of outgoing students, students progressing to higher education, ICT, computing skills, guidance for competitive examinations and career counselling through career guidance and placement cell. The students have qualified in state and national level examinations. The students are awarded with medals and certificates for outstanding performance in sports and cultural activities at inter-university, state and national level. The college has the functional online/offline grievance portal for its timely redressal through grievance committee with zero tolerance policy. The college has registered an Alumni Association for the development of the institution. The

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alumni of the college are serving various posts in administration, education, professional services, entrepreneurship, politics etc. The alumni of the college offer support to the college in the form of cash, books, water cooler, fan and other student supportive items. The college website has an alumni registration link. The alumni contribute in policy making by their representation in the statutory and academic committees such as IQAC and Janbhagidari samiti.

# Governance, Leadership and Management

The vision of college is empowerment of common rural students through quality education and the mission is to develop responsible citizens of the nation with moral values. The college principal is the supreme head with DDO authority. The college has various functional committees and cells to support the academic & administrative work. The principal monitors the work with different committees for the proper execution of plans and college management. The principal has a team of IQAC coordinator, departmental heads, head clerk and accountant to assist the governance of the college. The college administration is fully transparent, participative and decentralized. The admission and examination process are completely under the supervision of the principal. The college emphasizes on enhanced teaching and learning methodology by the introduction of new academic programs, infrastructure, research, employability, co-curricular activities, MoU, mobilization of funds and alumni association. The non-government Janbhagidari fund is utilized for the smooth functioning of teaching-learning process and self-financed programs like PGDCA and DCA. The college NSS unit organizes camp and adopts one village every year. The IQAC conducts curricular and co-curricular activities through proper planning and regular monitoring. The teaching and non-teaching appointments are through government and local Janbhagidari samiti. The college has effective welfare measures for teaching and non-teaching staffs such as medical leave, EPF, gratuity, maternity leave, Encashment of EL, timely salary, duty leave, TA/DA, Uniform for Peon and Security Guards. The college teachers are provided with financial support to complete academic enhancement programs. The college follows a performance based comprehensive appraisal system for teaching and non-teaching staff through API/PBAS of faculties, feedback from students and monitoring of non-teaching staffs by principal. The college conducts internal and external financial audits by Audit General and HED, Chhattisgarh Government regularly. The office accountant checks and verifies the records of receipts & payments in the account ledger on daily basis. The college has well functioned IQAC to enhance the quality of college activities by collecting feedback from faculties, staff, students, parents and alumni at the end of session and making action plans after analysis. The college receives funds from Government, PD, RUSA and Janbhagidari.

### **Institutional Values and Best Practices**

The college provides co-education with consistently more girls admission. 30% reservation for girls are offered during admission. The college is aware of girls safety through programs from Team Rakshak of police department, legal counsel and CDPO office, Surajpur. The college offers Help-desk facility, suggestion and complaint box. The anti-sexual harassment and anti-ragging committee is constituted. The college uniform is compulsory for all students. The college has a facility of Day care child room, girls common-room with attached toilet, sanitary pads, first aid medicines and has 100 bedded girls hostel. Webinars are organized on gender sensitization and counseling to girls. The college implements the use of LED bulbs, power efficient equipment, solar energy, wheeling to the grid facilities. The college has proper management of degradable and non-degradable waste through SLRM (Solid & Liquid Resource Management) center, Surajpur. The college has proper rain water harvesting, borewell and well-maintained water distribution system. College has a green and plastic free campus with pedestrian friendly pathways and bicycle stands. Energy and Green audits have

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been performed by the concerned authority. The environmental promotion activities are performed by plantation, cleanliness drive by the students and NSS volunteers. College has developed disabled-friendly environment through wheelchair, crutches, divyangjan friendly ramps, washrooms, staff assistance, reader and scribe. The college has sensitized the students to cultural, regional, linguistic, communal and socio-economic diversities of the state and nation through celebration of cultural and regional festivals, teachers and staff participation in student's family festivals and rituals. The college organizes national and international commemorative days, events, festivals and several events on constitutional obligations like Independence Day, Republic Day, Gandhi Jayanti, Human Rights Day etc. The college has implemented a code of conduct for students, teachers and staff.

**Best Practice 1-** The science departments distribute old practical covers to reduce financial load on students, reduce environmental pollution, develop awareness for 3R (Reuse, Recycle and Reduce) and reduce the storage area in the department.

# Institutional preparedness for NEP

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:

The vision and mission of the college fulfills the motto by providing best education and learning methods for the holistic development of the students. The participation of students, teaching and non-teaching staff in extension activities, social outreach, skill development programs, national and international conferences, workshops, seminars, webinars, social meetings, physical fitness practices, discussions and debates on social, ethical issues and soft skills. To meet the challenges of 21st century, a well-rounded individual with critical capacities such as intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, and moral in an integrated manner. The college provides an effective learning platform for students

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by broadening the horizons of education beyond their subject knowledge by offering CBCS courses at all PG programmes. The CBCS allows students to choose their subjects from fundamental to advanced level including performing course and curriculum projects in interdisciplinary and applied subjects for example project work by all PG and BCA students. The PG students perform dissertation/project work and are engaged with laboratory training and community services in the adjoining villages. The students visit and disseminate knowledge and information about women education, empowerment, health, personal hygiene, caring and educating of old people, water conservation, energy conservation and Swachhta Abhiyan. The above practice provides an equal opportunity for students to enhance knowledge, develop skills, build self-confidence so as to create a positive temperament and develop a deep impact on their life. The college faculty is engaged in interdisciplinary/multidisciplinary research projects on thrust areas of social economic issues such as innovative technological solutions for control of termites by formulation of termiticide besides carrying forward the research in fundamental and applied science in academic collaboration with other departments. The college has initiated skill development activities in multidisciplinary subjects encompassing Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Botany, Zoology and Computer applications where students from any stream can acquire extra skills in the interdisciplinary subjects of their choice. The college started Interdisciplinary Study and Research Form (ISRF) in science, commerce, arts and computer faculties.

2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The college follows the statutes and guidelines of HED, Raipur (C.G) and adopts instructions of Sant Gahira Guru Vishwavidyalaya, Ambikapur, Surguja (C.G.) for various programs such as student admission, teaching-learning instructions, examination and evaluation processes. The college administration welcomes and appreciates the concept of academic bank of credits as proposed in NEP 2020 and shall adopt the same later whenever introduced by the HED and university in forthcoming academic sessions.

3. Skill development:

The college has planned to start VAC (Value aided course) to develop additional opportunities for the

skill development of their stockholders. The college faculty tries their level best for imparting the right values in students by adopting the practices that promote women's empowerment, ensure eco friendly and environmentally sustainable campus and inculcate social responsibility through several outreach programs. Offering an inclusive environment promoting tolerance and reverence towards diversities, sensitization of students towards constitutional obligations as responsible citizens, undertaking green initiatives including vigorous plantation drives, management of the green gold of the campus and effective facilities for the management of degradable and non-degradable waste are an integral component of the College. To shape the students as ambassadors of community welfare, the college undertakes various extension programs like NSS, Red Ribbon club and SWEEP. The students play an active role in creating awareness among the local population about COVID, environment awareness, HIV-AIDS, other dreadful diseases, road safety, conservation and management of natural resources in addition to cleanliness and blood donation drives. The college follows the university syllabus in which paper-IV (Social outreach and skill development) is compulsory for all PG courses.

4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):

Chhattisgarh is identified as a herbal state surrounded by several dams, valleys, hills and dense forest. The languages spoken by the inhabitants of this state are Chhattisgarhi, Halbi, Gondi, Kurukh and Hindi. Though the language of "Chhattisgarhi" is used by natives, which is easily plausible by other residents of Chhattisgarh. The common language of communication used for instructions in offline and online teaching is Hindi followed by English. All the faculties, irrespective of their linguistic background, use Hindi and English to impart teaching and mentoring processes. The college organizes several events like world Hindi day, Kabir Jayanti etc. to promote the spread of literature and languages. Moreover, the college library has a collection of a good number of books which are the products of national and international writers on allied subjects. There is a huge repository of books on languages, religion, art, and culture. However, the college faculties will be motivated and encouraged to adopt

	the methods positively if such initiatives are undertaken by the college.
5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):	Currently, the mode of education adopted by the college is the conventional system in which students are given grades and rankings compared to each other. Content and performance expectations are based primarily on what has been taught in the class during the academic session. Time and again, it has been realised that the conventional methods beyond the classroom teacher have paid little attention to know whether or not students learn any of the material. Nevertheless, it is again the prerogative of college to adopt an OBE system that is distinguished from the traditional methods by the way it incorporates three elements: theory of education, a systematic structure for education, and a specific approach to instructional practice whenever, decisions are taken by the HED, Raipur and University administration, the college would contribute, in alignment with its vision and mission, in organising the educational system towards what is considered essential for the learners to successfully do at the end of their learning experiences. The primary focus of the proposed OBE system will be on the following skills such as life skills, basic skills, professional, intellectual skills and interpersonal and personal skills with the potential benefits to create a clear expectation of what needs to be accomplished by the end of the course; structure their lessons around the student's needs; determine what credits to award the student; feel responsible for their own learning, and learn more through this individual learning. The Outcomes analysis will involve the analytical reports rigorously based on student performances and satisfaction feedback and employability index. Outcome analysis requires a huge amount of data to be churned and made available at any time, anywhere. It is believed that outcome analysis will help to find gaps and carry out continuous improvement to align with the mission of NEP 2020.
6. Distance education/online education:	The college doesn't run distance education but during COVID-19 situation online classes were conducted regularly. COVID-19 affected everyone in the past two years, setting a new normal not only in societal living but also in way the college disseminate education and develop skill-sets. The college has

successfully performed its academic as well as administrative duties even throughout the complete lockdown periods. A plethora of online platforms was floated from the tech world to provide education through online mode along with setting-up of virtual labs to continue theoretical as well as practical education of the students and the college faculty fully utilized the online teaching platforms and kept performing their academic duties whilst delivering online lectures through modules such as Googlemeet, Teachmint, Zoom etc. Classes through video conferencing, online meetings, mentoring, and creating e-content have been a tremendous experience for all the stakeholders (students, faculty, administrative officers, and non-teaching staff) in the college. The college faculty used resources (Internet services, Power point presentations, Projectors, Smart boards, Smart writing pads etc. at a personal level as well as from the college support to develop their skills for teaching with appropriate behavior during COVID-19 pandemic or online teaching. This experience obviously is potentially enough to offer vocational courses through open and distance learning (ODL) and Distance education/online education in view of NEP 2020.

# 1.1.1 The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

# **Response:**

The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process. The college is under the Department of Higher Education, Government of Chhattisgarh and is affiliated to Sant Gahira Guru Vishwavidyalaya, Ambikapur (Formerly Sarguja Vishwavidyalaya, Ambikapur) and follows the prescribed curriculum and syllabus of the same. For undergraduate programs like B.A., B.Sc., B.Com. and B.C.A. the syllabus is designed by Central Board of Studies, Department of Higher Education, Government of Chhattisgarh which is forwarded by the university to the college and for all PG programs (CBCS mode), the syllabus is provided by the university and followed by the college. Faculty of the college are working as members in several committees of the college/university. Faculty members of the college perform a monthly division of the whole curriculum of each paper and prepare teaching plans. All the faculty members mention a monthly proposed curriculum in their daily diary. Faculty members teach according to the proposed curriculum and they do signature after mentioning the status of prescribed curriculum whether completed/incompleted and the principal certifies it in a monthly report or daily diary. The college prepares an academic calendar based on the prescribed calendar provided by the Department of Higher Education, Government of Chhattisgarh. The college organizes internal examinations like unit tests, quarterly and half yearly examinations as per the HED academic calendar. Question papers of halfyearly/model examinations are prepared based on the annual examination pattern. The faculties of the college also provide question banks and other study materials to the students every year in order to enhance their questions solving ability and writing skills to prepare them for the final examinations. Each PG department organizes departmental seminars, group discussions, and educational tour/field trips for effective delivery of curriculum in a well-planned manner. Periodic meetings of IQAC meetings are also organized to review the academic progress of teaching-learning, among other things. Regular meetings of the department with the principal are held to monitor effective curriculum delivery and to address any difficulty faced in curricular transactions. Regular feedback is taken from teachers, students and alumni on the curriculum to make the teaching-learning process best suited. College has a sufficient number of classrooms and a well-equipped laboratories, ICT rooms with internet facility, LAN & Wi-Fi connectivity. Guest lecturers are appointed against vacant posts of Assistant Professor and Professors as per the instructions from Commissioner, Department of Higher Education, Chhattisgarh. Webinar/Seminar/ Guest lectures are organized by the college to strengthen the curricular delivery system.

The principal of the college regularly conducts meetings of various college committees to ensure the better functioning of the curricular and co-curricular activities. To run online classes smoothly during COVID situation, there are various Whatsapp groups subject wise to share online classes link, study materials and other academic/online co-curricular activities information. Students are encouraged to visit the college website for the latest update information of college. Academic calendar is followed by the faculty and students to adhere to the completion of academic activities. Under the continuous internal evaluation (CIE) regular unit tests are organized by the faculty member quarterly and half yearly examinations are conducted by the college according to academic calendar. In this way teachers can identify advanced learners and slow learners. In addition, extra classes are organized for slow learners to give them extra academic attention. With a view to give an academic platform to advance learners in different subjects. All science departments of the college have constituted KECs (Knowledge Enrichment Circle). A faculty member of the department concerned acts as the coordinator of KEC and the advanced learners of that particular department are taken as members. This circle meets on a quarterly basis to discuss and share advanced level knowledge in the subject area concerned. The regular faculties of college complete their orientation/ induction program, Refresher course and faculty Development Programs as per UGC, New Delhi and HED, Chhattisgarh norms for skill upgradation/updating knowledge.

## **Response:**

The college follows the curriculum prescribed by the Sant Gahira Guru university, Ambikapur and HED, Government of Chhattisgarh. The university integrates cross-cutting issues relevant to Gender, Environment and Sustainability, Human Values and Professional Ethics into the curriculum. According to the syllabus of UG and PG programs, issues relevant to Environment and sustainability are taught as per following -

- 1. **Undergraduate programs** (BA, B.Sc, B.Com, BCA)- In first year environmental studies paper is compulsory to adopt as one compulsory paper which is related to environment and sustainability.
- 2. **Post-Graduate programs** (M.A, M.Sc., M.Com.)- semester course Research methodology paper and social outreach and skill development paper, Intellectual Property Right, environment paper and Dissertation paper are compulsory which is related to human values and professional ethics.
- (i) M.Sc. Botany syllabus includes systematics, biodiversity, evolution, principles of ecology and environment, pest and agricultural ecology, plant physiology, plant morphology, plant anatomy, developmental biology, flowering physiology, parasitism etc. as Environmental and Sustainability and Human values.
- (ii) M.Sc. Chemistry syllabus includes Research methodology & computer application is based on professional ethics, social outreach & skill development and applied chemistry enhances professional ethics, 3rd Semester contains Intellectual property, Human Rights, Tribal studies which are based on Human Values and Environmental Basics & green Chemistry based on environment and sustainability.

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- (iii) M.Com. syllabus includes advanced accounting, management accounting, research methodology & computer application, marketing management etc. in semester 1st which are related to professional ethics.
- (iv) M.A Sociology syllabus includes Gender and society, Perspectives on Indian society etc. as gender values. Syllabus also includes social anthropology, Urban values etc. as Human values. Syllabus also contains research methodology in social research etc. as professional ethics.
- (v) M.A Political science syllabus includes Tribal studies, Democracy and human rights etc. as Human values. Syllabus also includes Indian Government and politics, Ethics and politics, social movements and Human values, Indian political thoughts etc. under Political ethics, Gender equality and Human values. The syllabus includes IPR, Foreign policy and international securities as professional ethics.
- (vi) M.A Economics syllabus includes Research methodology & computer application is based on professional ethics, Constitutionalism and Indian political system, Tribal studies also covers human values. Micro and macroeconomics, Public economics, Industrial economics, managerial economics, Economics of Insurance, Economics of financial markets and institutions, Agricultural economics, Economics of entrepreneurship etc. as professional ethics. Environmental and forest laws, Agricultural economics, Environmental economics as environment and sustainability.
- (vii) M.A Hindi syllabus includes paryavaran avam vaniki vidi and chhayavad as Environmental values.

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# 2.2 Catering to Student Diversity

# 2.2.1 The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organises special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

# **Response:**

During admission, teachers provide necessary guidance regarding choice of the subjects to students. The concerned course teacher helps them to select programs which are useful to them. The students are briefed about the subject content and career options in selecting the same during the student induction program. Initial lectures are specially designed to prepare students to enhance their capacity to understand the subject matter of their programs. The college regularly assesses learning levels of advanced and slow learners through unit tests, CCA, end-semester exams, assignments, presentations, viva-voce exam for PG students and unit tests and half yearly exam for UG students. Thereafter, the advanced learners and slow learners are closely supervised, provided with all the required facilities and guided by faculty members. Advanced learners are encouraged for in depth reading and to participate in co-curricular activities, stimulating class discussion and perform presentations for both UG and PG students. Advanced learners are encouraged to help their weaker classmates. In this way teachers can identify advanced learners and slow learners. In addition, extra classes are organized for slow learners to give them extra academic attention. With a view to give an academic platform to advance learners in different subjects. All science departments of the college have constituted KECs (Knowledge Enrichment Circle). A faculty member of the department concerned acts as the coordinator of KEC and the advanced learners of that particular department are taken as members. This circle meets on a quarterly basis to discuss and share advanced level knowledge in the subject area concerned. Personal counseling is provided by the principal and teachers for all students. Slow learners as per their capability are provided with extra support for their advancement. The college has given clear instruction to all faculties to conduct offline / online classes separately for advanced and slow learners during holidays and vacations. Faculty members try their best to boost the confidence of weak students. Slow learners are encouraged to consult their respective teachers for solutions to their problems. Special attention is focused on the attendance of slow learners. Personal counseling is provided to them for academic improvement by providing lecture notes and video lectures through online platforms as a part of blended learning system for the students having different learning capabilities. All meritorious students are felicitated with prizes and certificates during the college annual function.

### For slow learners:

The following key points are considered to identify the slow learner and advanced learner:

- 1. As per previous board and university exam results.
- 2. Marks obtained in the unit test and half yearly exam results.
- 3. By response of the students for oral questions in the classroom by faculties.
- 4. Attendance percentage in classes.
- 5. To check their assignments.

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For advanced learners:

Advanced learners are encouraged by following methods:

- 1. KEC constituted.
- 2. College organizes expert lectures, industrial or skill development training, webinars or online seminars to enhance their knowledge.
- 3. Additional skill development is provided through powerpoint presentation, field work and livelihood training.
- 4. Faculty members motivate the student to participate in seminars and training.
- 5. Students are motivated to use ICT tools such as YouTube, PDF notes, N-List, PG-Pathshala and online class platforms like Google classroom, Google meet, Zoom, Teachmint.

# 2.3 Teaching- Learning Process

# 2.3.1 Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

## **Response:**

The college focuses on quality education by adapting student centric methods of learning such as quizzes, debates and team work which are reflected in the project work along with co-curricular activities. The college practices various student centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies to enrich learning experiences. All the science programs integrate practical courses with adequate experimental practice for the students.

Moreover, project work, field-work, seminars, excursions, dissertation, social outreach program, NSS, Redribbon club are included in the syllabus. In the beginning of session, academic calendar is provided by

IQAC as per the norms of state higher education department and affiliating University.

All faculty members prepare the teaching plan before the beginning of classes for the effective teaching. The interactive question-answer session is also arranged by the teacher and the students are encouraged to ask questions. All the departments conduct skill development program/social outreach program for PG students. In the faculty of science and computer, there is ample scope for both experiential and practical learning for UG and PG students. In both UG and PG classes, each student does practical individually under the guidance of the teacher. In each U.G. and P.G. programs, there is a compulsory project/dissertation course that provides adequate opportunity to the students for practicing problem solving methodology. In the UG first year syllabus, there is a compulsory paper of environment and human rights as 'Environmental studies' in which project work is assigned to every student. Each student submits this paper project report and gives a viva-voce exam. Under student centric teaching-learning approach, each PG department provides facilities to students to complete their social outreach project and dissertation work in nearby laboratories, institutions and learning centers for their skill development. Institutions provide ample scope for participative learning to all the students through community-based practice.

Student centric teaching learning process adopted by the college is given below:

- **1.Team work:** College organizes various student activities to promote the teamwork spirit. Some activities such as NSS camp, village adoption, Tree plantation, Campus cleaning, Mask distribution during COVID situation, COVID awareness rally by following social distancing and COVID protocols, COVID vaccination camp, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Driving license camp, social outreach program, dissertation and trainings help students to learn art of living and improve the social and community welfare.
- **2. Debates:** Debates are organized on several topics at the college level on different occasions like annual functions. Our students participated and are awarded with prizes at district, division as well as state level competition under SVEEP program.
- **3. Project Work:** According to University syllabus all UG first year students are required to submit environmental studies project reports and all PG students must submit their social outreach program project report. After qualifying exams and submitting their project work report in the University, students receive the NSS "C" certificates.
- **4. Participation in competition:** The college organize various competition programs.
- **5. Field Visit:** The field visit is compulsory for all PG students in social outreach and skill development programs.

### **Response:**

In the current era of information technology, the incorporation of ICT enabled teaching and learning resources are the need of the hour. The ICT based data allows educator to evaluate their efficiency and effectiveness in modern as well as competitive teaching. All the faculties are adopting not only the traditional method of chalk and talk but are well trained to impart the class lectures through ICT based teaching methods. The academic session 2020-2021 was completely affected by Covid-19 pandemic and therefore ICT enabled tools such as computers, mobiles and the internet for teaching and learning process was the best possible option to impart quality education to the students. All the faculties of the college are effectively using ICT enabled tools such as desktop, laptops, smart mobile, mic, webcam, headphones, speaker, digital writing pad, internet, video-lectures, audio-lectures, power point presentations, overhead projector, virtual labs, YouTube link, e-journals, e-books, N-List and e-PG pathshala to impart effective teaching and learning. The college is well equipped with three ICT tools enabled rooms along with a smart classroom setup. All the faculties use Google meet, Google classroom, Zoom meeting, Teachmint, Webex and HECG online app as online teaching platforms and the concerned link for respective classes are shared to the students by whatsapp group. The college is an active member of INFLIBNET services by which faculties and students of the college are highly benefitted in acquiring updated knowledge by a good number of e-books, e-journals, e-magazines and e-contents. The college is equipped with 45 computers for academic purpose and 6 for non-academic purposes.

#### 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

## 2.5.1 Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode

#### **Response:**

The internal assessment includes unit test, half yearly, terminal exam for UG students and unit test, CCA tests, seminars, social outreach report evaluation for PG students under CBCS pattern. The respective subject teachers set the question papers as per the syllabus in accordance with the annual and CBCS semester examination. Internal examination helps subject teachers to analyse the performance of students. All the records related to internal examinations such as attendance sheet, question paper, valued answer books, summary of marksheets are properly maintained by the concerned committee of the department. Model answer and marking scheme is prepared by every subject teacher before valuation. After valuation of answer copies, it is distributed to the students for verification and grievances, if any, are redressed immediately. Unit tests, half yearly exams and CCA tests are very effective steps for internal assessment. The assessment copies after valuation and model answers are shown and discussed with students. The marks obtained by the students in internal assessment tests are recorded periodically in the register by the concerned department. In order to analyse the skill of the students, the day-to-day performance is assessed by the concerned faculty members in the laboratory. At the end of each academic session all the faculty members conduct doubt clearing classes for the students. On the basis of internal assessment, slow and advanced learners are identified and further necessary initiatives are taken accordingly.

The college exhibits an efficient mechanism so as to ensure transparent and efficient assessment process. The internal assessment includes unit test, half yearly, terminal exam for UG students and unit test, CCA tests, seminars and social outreach report evaluation for PG students under CBCS pattern. The respective subject teachers set the question paper as per syllabus in accordance with the annual and CBCS semester examination. Internal examination helps subject teachers to analyse the performance of students. All records related to internal examination such as attendance sheet, question paper, valued answer books, summary of marksheets are properly maintained by the concerned department and committee of the institute. Model answer and marking scheme is prepared by every subject teacher before evaluation. Answer scripts of internal assessment and assignments are discussed with students after evaluation and grievances if any is sorted within the department only, and in case grievances are not addressed satisfactorily, the students are free to approach the head of the college also. Concession in attendance can be claimed by students on medical ground and for participation in extracurricular activities as per the statues of the college.

# 3.2 Innovation Ecosystem

# 3.2.1 Institution has created an ecosystem for innovations and has initiatives for creation and transfer of knowledge

### **Response:**

The college has created an ecosystem for research, innovations and other extension initiatives for creation and transfer of knowledge by developing desirable human resources, taking care for creation and dissemination of knowledge. Despite low funding and human resources, the college encourages research and innovation among students and faculties. Faculty members are encouraged to undergo professional development programs like induction program, refresher course, faculty development program and to organize webinars, guest lectures and participate in conferences, seminars and workshops. The Department of Zoology and Botany has jointly started a minor research project on the social problem entitled 'Study of Termiticidal effect of different plant extract' funded by College Janbhagidari Samiti. The college organizes seminar/ webinar/guest lecture for transfer of knowledge time to time. The Department of Chemistry organized a 5 days international workshop on experimental techniques. The college has developed several research laboratories in the respective areas of research. The college has a well-equipped Botany, Chemistry, Zoology and Computer labs for experiential learning and research work. The PG departmental library has about 1200 books for academic and research purposes. The faculty members are also encouraged to guide research activities. All PG departments are recognized as research centers by the affiliating university. Two faculty members of the college currently as research guides by the affiliating university. Five faculties are registered for Ph.D. programs in different universities. Faculty members are also encouraged to go for research publication. The Faculty members of Chemistry and Zoology have published two research papers in reputed international journals. An innovative activity is continuing in the

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Department of Zoology, where students are taught to preserve the dead animals by wet and dry preservative methods and also to collect local insects to prepare insect boxes. The Department of Botany is also doing innovative activities by collection of local seed varieties as gene bank preparation and preservation by using seed collection boxes. The Department of Botany has developed an artificial small pond in the college campus and the Department of Zoology has prepared a glass aquarium for ecology and environmental research. The university syllabus has a compulsory paper of research methodology and computer application in 1st Semester (PG Programs) for promoting research. In all PG programs, students participate in project work/ social outreach and skill development/Dissertation which help them to innovate and create knowledge. For experiential learning, well equipped laboratories are available in Zoology, Botany, Chemistry and computer subjects. The college has one MoU with CIPET, Korba for industrial training to PG students and one institutional collaboration with Shivnath Science College, Rajnandgaon (C.G.) for student and teacher exchange and promotion of academic and research activities. Special awareness programs, sessions and coaching are usually conducted by Career Guidance & Placement cell which help the students to move onto a right direction with regards to their careers. A twitter account with ID @PgGovt has been started for latest placement and admission updates by Career Guidance & Placement cell. The NSS unit perform many activities transfer of knowledge. The college has also a plan to establish an incubation centre to facilitate innovation, flexible and economical solutions for various research related problems.

#### 3.4 Extension Activities

3.4.1 Extension activities are carried out in the neighborhood community, sensitizing students to social issues, for their holistic development, and impact thereof during the last five years.

### **Response:**

The extension and outreach programs are planned and organized by the college in such a way that they supplement the education provided in class room teaching for both UG and PG students. The programs not only teach lessons of life but also provides practical exercise of learning with co-curricular activities and involvement of students in many activities like:

- NSS
- Red Ribbon Club
- Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat programme
- Swacch-Bharat Summer-internship
- Cleanliness drive
- Voter awareness (SVEEP)
- Fit India movement/ Yoga
- Social outreach programme etc

These units take the responsibility of community-based activities. The Red Ribbon Club unit organizes AIDS awareness, talks and rallies, blood-group checking, anti-worm tablet distribution etc. The college is situated in a tribal area so most of the people of villages suffer with illiteracy, superstition, lack of medical facilities and poverty. Various activities are organized by the institution for upliftment of the tribal people and also for holistic development of students through different institutional unit activities from time to time. The NCC unit has been approved but due to COVID situation it will be started in the next academic session. Every year a village is adopted by N.S.S. unit and the whole year faculty and students visit the adopted village. This year Tilsiwan was adopted by the college. Seven days special N.S.S. camp has been organized in this village. Here students learn mutual cooperation with the villagers. They learn to live in limited resources and learn about rural life. Various activities are organized under camp with active cooperation of village people. Following activities are held under these camps -

- Students rally for Voters
- COVID awareness Wide campaign for Swachh Bharat Abhiyan.
- AIDS awareness initiative
- Health checkup camp Yoga activities
- Legal literacy program on POCSO act
- Lecture on Environment awareness
- Cattle Health Checkup camp
- Lecture on Mushroom culture etc.

Preservation of cultural and ancient knowledge of tribes of nearby villages by our students and faculty is an important activity of outreach programs. They work for leadership and political awareness in the nearby community. NSS campus ambassador of the college visits nearby villages and works for hundred percent voter's participation in elections. They also work for eradication of poverty, illiteracy and AIDS awareness.

In 2020 the college students work hard for Covid-19 awareness among nearby communities like distribution of masks and sanitizers. All other units of the college also work with N.S.S. for outreach programs. NSS volunteers are involved in Life Line Express Health Train activities this year. # **Criterion 4 - Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

### 4.1 Physical Facilities

4.1.1 The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

### **Response:**

The college is situated at Navapara, Surajpur and acquiring 10.56 Hectare of land area. College has adequate facilities for teaching and learning process. The college has its own campus with two buildings equipped with CCTV cameras. There are 2 common rooms for girls with all required facilities, separate washrooms for girls, boys and staff members, indoor and outdoor stadiums with an open and indoor gym, yoga cum music room, 8 borewells for water supply, RO water purifiers. The entire campus is covered with greenery all around and is surrounded by a boundary wall. There are a total 51 computer sets available for academic and administrative purposes. The college also has complaint boxes, wheel chair, crutches, fire extinguishers, Divyangjan friendly toilet, notice boards and a board on which "Idea of the Day" is written. Following are the details of the college infrastructure.

- **1. Main old-building:** This building was handed over in 1991. Initially, the college was 17 rooms single storey building and in 2013 one big hall was constructed on first floor which was further partitioned into two parts for classroom and lab purpose and currently the lab has been shifted to new RUSA building. It consists of the principal's room, office room, account section, NSS room, Examination control room, physics Laboratory, IQAC/NAAC room, smart seminar room, conference room, Art and commerce departments, 09 class rooms and a big hall, one girl's common room on the first floor.
- **2. New Building (RUSA)**: This building is single storey and handed over to college in 2019. initially it consisted of 8 big rooms, but later it further partitioned and now totally 20 rooms in it for better utilization. There are 4 labs for zoology, chemistry, botany and computer science, 3 smart classrooms with ICT Facility, 05 classrooms, 4 departments and a girl common room and veranda is also being used for botany, zoology and chemistry lab purposes. All classrooms are equipped with adequate furniture, blackboards/whiteboards, fans, lights, etc.
- **3. Library building:** The college has a well-furnished library cum reading room and having sufficient books as per the strength of the college. The library is automated with KOHA software. There are magazines, journals and newspapers also available in the library. It has two floors. The ground floor is used for keeping old books and the library. On the first floor there is a reading room cum library. The college has also subscribed N-List Inflibnet services by which students and staff members are benefitted with e-books, e-journals, e-magazines etc.

# 4.4.2 There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc.

#### **Response:**

The college adopts systematic procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities like laboratory, library, sports, computers, classrooms etc. There are 51 computers in the college in which 6 computers are used for administrative purposes and remaining 45 for academic purposes. The computers are maintained by the recognized firms to ensure maximum utilization of these computers. There are five laboratories in the college in which experimental learning is going on in a proper way. There is a laboratory for Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physics, and the computer department. There are sufficient instruments and experimental materials available in the laboratories. It is a sole responsibility of the officer in-charge of the respective laboratory to update and maintain the respective laboratory. There is a well-equipped library and reading room in the college. There are sufficient books, periodical magazines, journals and newspapers in the library. Library is partially automated with KOHA software. Currently there is a librarian and library committee which makes policies for smooth running of libraries. The library has a drop box where students put their suggestions which in turn are processed by the members of the

library committee. The committee takes appropriate actions in collaboration with the IQAC. The committee analyses the information and takes corrective/improvement measures, if needed. The college has a subscription of N-list inflibnet services by which college students and faculty members are benefited with e-contents. In the sports department facilities for various indoor games such as chess, carom and badminton are available. In our college outdoor games facilities are also available. There is a well maintained sports ground for various outdoor games such as football, volley-ball, cricket, kho-kho, basket-ball and kabaddi etc. Details of cleanliness program-

- 1. There are eight employees for this purpose. Two of them are government employees and the other six are appointed by JBS. JBS employees clean the campus on a regular basis. They sanitize the classrooms, office, smart class, seminar room, laboratory and veranda. One JBS employee looks after the plants. Sweeper cleans all the 17 toilets daily.
- 2. Dustbins are kept in the veranda, hall and college building entrance. Students are asked to throw the rough paper in these dustbins. NSS volunteers take part in the cleanliness awareness program held by NSS.
- 3. Since there is no any lab-attendant against the sanctioned post, so these JBS employees clean the laboratory time-to-time under the supervision of H.O.D. Lab technician also takes care of instruments.
- 4. Water purifier is maintained from time-to-time.

Details of academic and support facilities-

- 1. There is an inverter for office purposes.
- 2. Projectors, Computers, CCTVs, Wi-Fi and anti-virus etc. are maintained by a responsible officer from teaching staff.
- 3. If there is any mechanical or functional error in above academic and support facilities, the HOD has to write an application to the Principal for its maintenance.
- 4. A professional mechanic also observes these issues if the problem is not solved.

Maintenance of library and sports facilities

- 1. There is a book-lifter in this college. He keeps the library maintenance.
- 2. Currently there is a sports officer appointed by the HED Chhattisgarh. The Maintenance of the sports ground is done under his supervision.
- 3. Infrastructure and furniture Maintenance:- The building was constructed from state PWD (Public work department). In time-to-time PWD maintains the college building and its white-washes and repairs the building if necessary. The strength of the college is increasing every year. The number of examinees in regular and private classes is increasing every year. So, the furniture is a necessary item to maintain. Keeping this in mind, every year furniture is either purchased or damaged furniture is repaired. The expenditure in the Maintenance head: 2020-2021 is 19.96 Lakh.

Government Rewati Raman Mishra P.G. Administration is fully transparent and participative, for instance the purchasing system in the college is very transparent and decentralized. There are purchasing rules of the Government of Chhattisgarh. College

The grant sanctioned by RUSA was 70 lacs utilized for renovation.

The College also utilized its non-governmental Janbhagidari funds for smooth functioning and enhancement of its teaching-learning process. Janbhagidari Lecturers were appointed to share excess teaching load for which the sanctioned faculty strength is not adequately sufficient. The salaries of Janbhagidari Lecturers and Janbhagidari workers were drawn from the non-governmental Janbhagidari fund of the College. This is one of the activities successfully implemented based on the strategic plan. Self-financed programmes like DCA and PGDCA are also running successfully with the help of Janbhagidari Lecturers. The Guest Lecturers are also appointed in the College according to the norms of Higher Education Department, C.G. Govt. & UGC. Thus, the College made concerted efforts to explore various sources to mobilize funds as outlined in its Strategic Plans and has been successful in receiving various types of financial assistance from both the government and non-government sectors for its overall development.

There is also Community Engagement as follows

Under this system, API/PBAS forms, confidential reports, and feedback from students are collected and analyzed by the College administration. Staff Self-Appraisal: Staff self-appraisal is carried out through a PBAS form, which is to be filled and submitted by each faculty member at the end of every academic year and after principal remarks it is sent to Commissioner HED Chhattisgarh through proper channels. Students' feedback on teacher's academic performance and quality in teaching process appraises and identifies the performance appraisal criterion of the teaching staff.

AQAR reports of IQAC, participation in orientation, Refresher and FDP programs, academic progress like Ph.D., NET / SET qualifications, carrying out the major and minor research projects, paper presentation, publication of articles in journals and books and participation in National and International seminar and conferences are some measures and features for performance appraisal of faculty members.

#### **Response:**

The College through its established IQAC set-up regularly reviews its teaching-learning process, structures & methodologies of operations and learning outcomes time to time as per norms and records the incremental improvement in various activities by performing the feedback analysis of the stakeholders and taking actions based on the analysis of feedback.

Feedback Analysis: The Colleges' IQAC collect feedback from stakeholders namely students, parents, alumni and teachers at the end of session. All the feedback collected from stakeholders are thoroughly analysed by the IQAC members. The responses & suggestions of the stakeholders are integrated to the action plan of IQAC for the upcoming academic sessions.

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In this academic session feedback from stakeholders is collected through google form. Analysis of Alumni and Teachers' Feedbacks Students are provided with printed feedback forms on various parameters. Analysis of student feedback is done which is based on Teaching and College like subject knowledge of teacher, teaching method, ICT based teaching, interactive & comprehensive Teaching, Conduct of Teachers, Syllabus Completion, Students' Academic Encouragement, Study Material Provision, Personality Development, Cleanliness / Drinking Water facility, assignment, lab facility etc. and the responses of the feedback are asked on the scale of Excellent, Good, average and below average. The analysis of Feedback from regular students of UG & PG classes is noted very seriously. Based on the responses of the stakeholders, the IQAC committee in consultation with the Principal tries to incorporate changes for improvement and betterment so that the follow up actions on enactment of recommendations given by the stakeholders are taken care of.

Several actions have been taken by the College Admin & IQAC to facilitate the students in their continuous process of learning and to facilitate the teachers in their persistent process of teaching and thereby improving the student centric amenities, teaching tools, educational quality and administrative efficiency of the College. 7.1.1 Measures initiated by the Institution for the promotion of gender equity during the last five years.

#### **Response:**

The college provides co-education to both genders in the same classroom. In this institution, there are consistently more girls admitted than boys. According to HED, Raipur admission guidelines, 30% reservations for girls are offered during admission for both UG and PG programmes. By ensuring that students of both genders get fair and impartial treatment, the college upholds gender equity and every student has an equal chance to participate. The institution is utmost concerned with the safety and security of all of its students. Female students are counseled by explaining the laws and regulations that apply to their safety and the Sexual Harassment Cell and the Discipline Cell address any issues that girls have. Additionally, the college occasionally organizes a girls safety awareness programme through a number of government agencies, including the police department, legal counsel and CDPO office. For ease to girls college offers Help-desk facility for all of the necessary information and some stationeries, printout, xerox in order to resolve their issues. Additionally, suggestion and complaint boxes have been placed across the college campus, and they are controlled and opened by the Grievance Redressal Cell. The college has implemented a number of measures towards gender equality in our curriculum and extracurricular activities. The anti-sexual harassment, anti-ragging committee is highly active at the college. After a programme on Beti- Bachao Beti Padhao was held in the college in August 2016, the college decided to support the goals of this national initiative. The college has started the following initiatives in our institution to promote gender equality and protect women:

- 1. **College uniform** For all regular students college uniform is compulsory which provides uniformity amongst students. We can easily spot students in any place where security is provided, especially for female students on campus and off campus.
- 2. **Day care child room**: The college has a unique facility as Day care child room for needy female staff and students for nursing and resting their child.
- 3. **Separate girl's hostel**: The college has currently 100 bedded full fledged girls hostel students. Area is under CCTV surveillance and warden and female staff are available at the hostel.
- 4. **Internal compliance facility**: The College has an internal compliance facility system.Student may complain about any issue of discrimination directly to the principal/in-charge or write about at the link given at college website highlighted as "Student's Grievance Cell".
- 5. **Separate Girls common room**: The College has three girls common-room with attached toilet for any needful requirement.
- 6. **Safety and security measures**: On 15.12.2021, Team Rakshak of the Police department provides safety to girls through proper alertness, training and an emergency number launched by SP Surajpur.
- 7. Gender sensitization webinar and counseling: webinar on 'Gender Sensitization: Issues and

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Challenges' on 31.07.2021 was organized by "Women harassment and gender sensitization cell". Cell has also given Counseling to girls on 30.12.2021.

- 8. **Distribution of sanitary pads and medicines**: The College has a facility for sanitary pads at low cost and free first aid medicines.
- 9. **Implimentation of VISHAKHA Guidelines**: The college is alert to implimentation of the **VISHAKHA Guidelines**.

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#### **Response:**

The college facilitates several methods for the management of degradable and non-degradable waste. "Green and Clean Campus" is the motto of our institution. Entire campus is free from any type of pollution.

- 1. **Solid waste management** College campus and girls hostel has different dustbins (green and blue) which are identified and set up for disposal of wet and biodegradable wastes (Green dust bin) and for disposal of plastic wrappers and non-biodegradable wastes (Blue dust bin). All the wastage is collected by municipality service on a daily basis from girls hostel and the college campus for recycle and manure conversion on SLRM (Solid & Liquid Resource Management) center ward no.-4, Surajpur. College peons, NSS volunteers and students keep the campus clean and green. The college has a write-up committee who approves the sale of college solid scrapes like waste papers, furniture, e-wastes etc. to recyclers for waste management.
- 2. **Liquid waste management** Liquid waste from the toilets, drinking water and labs is let out as effluent into a proper drainage facility and to avoid stagnation. The chemical waste (solid & liquid) produced from the chemistry lab is collected in a separate non-reactive plastic container and also due to low consumption of chemical wastes from Botany and Zoology lab, the chemical waste is dropped into chemistry lab's non-reactive plastic container which is further collected by municipality service on a daily basis for their management in SLRM (Solid & Liquid Resource Management) centre ward no.-4, Surajpur. Wash basin waste water from Chemistry lab is drained out through the pipe line which is connected to the soak pit and from Botany and Zoology lab, wash basin waste water is drained out to the soil to reuse water because it is not harmful.
- 3. **Biomedical waste management**: Being majority of girls in college, the biomedical waste generated on a daily basis is used as sanitary pads. The used sanitary pads and also first aid waste materials are collected in a dustbin and disposed off by Municipality service on a daily basis as per solid waste management.
- **4. E-waste management** The college write-up committee approves the sale of college e-waste to recyclers. In this way e-waste management is carried out.
- 5. **Waste recycling system** There is no system of waste recycling in the college. However, there is a rain water harvesting system and soak pits in the college. Recycling of wastes is carried out by municipality service on their site.
- 6. **Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste management** In our institution there is no hazardous chemical and radioactive wastes. So, there is no Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste management system in the college.

The college celebrates various national and international commemorative days, events and festivals to inculcate the spirit and essence of day among the learners for moral and ethical development of students and staff. It is the sole motto of the institution to transform the students into responsible citizens of tomorrow committed to nation and society. The College makes tremendous efforts in celebrating national and international days, events, and festivals throughout the year. Independence Day (15 August) is celebrated to mark the independence of India. On this day, our students participate in various formal events including flag-hoisting and speech which is organized to commemorate the day of freedom culminating in the distribution of sweets. Republic Day is celebrated on January 26 to commemorate the adoption of the constitution every year. These days complete staff get involved in the plantation and cleanliness mission along with NSS volunteers. 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#### 7.2 Best Practices

7.2.1 Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution as per NAAC format provided in the Manual.

#### **Response:**

**BEST PRACTICE-I** 

#### **Title of the Practice:**

Distribution of old practical copy hard covers to B.Sc. and M.Sc. students.

#### **Objective of the Practice:**

The main objectives of this practice are as under:

- 1.To reduce the financial load on students.
- 2. To conserve the environment by reuse of the item.
- 3. To reduce environmental pollution.
- 4. To develop awareness and capability of students for 3R (Reuse, Recycle and Reduce).
- 5. The distribution of old hard covers also nulls the storage area in the department.

#### **Context:**

Most of the students of college are from rural background having low income and paying capacity. The students are unable to purchase books and stationeries themselves due to poverty and limited source of family income. College provides some stationary items to the ST-SC students like pencil, copy, sharpener and scale from ST-SC stationary fund provided by the Government of Chhattisgarh. All the students belonging to ST, SC and OBC categories receive the scholarship from the Government of Chhattisgarh. The faculties of science countered this situation by thinking to help students by providing old hard covers practical copy to B.Sc. (Biology), M.Sc. Botany and M.Sc. Zoology students. Thereafter, the faculties of Botany and Zoology departments collectively provide previous years old practical copy hard covers submitted by private students to all current year students. The above practice plays a key role towards environmental conservation by the concept of 3R (Reuse, Recycle and Reduce) as well as this practice also provides financial assistance to the students of the college.

#### The Practice:

All students receive two covers (one each for botany and zoology) from the concerned departments which

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are resubmitted again during his/her botany and zoology practical exam in each academic session. After that student receives his/her previous years old practical covers again from the concerned departments after declaration of university results. The collected previous years old practical covers are again reused in the subsequent next year practical examination. In this way a student reuses previous years collected covers in each academic session of University practical exams (3 times) and saves his/her money approximately two hundred rupees in B.Sc. course. The cost of each practical cover in the market book shop is ranging from Rs. 20 to Rs. 30. Each M.Sc. Botany and M.Sc. Zoology student saves at least five hundred rupees in his/her course by getting cover files and assignment folders from the respective departments. The cost of each practical herbarium file cover in the market book shop is ranging from Rs. 40-50 whereas, the cost for the assignment folder is ranging from Rs. 05-10. The college provides approximately 600 cover files to concerned students. The above practice not only saves the environment but money as well. The practice is of great significance to null the storage area in the concerned department thereby providing ample space for accommodating several laboratory equipment and instruments.

#### **Evidence of Success:**

All the students of the concerned departments become very delighted to receive the practical cover files and assignment folders free of cost again and again from the departments. The students not only receive the file covers but are also trained to reuse and the importance of recycling the products. The above practice inculcates a temperament of environmental safety and space management among the students.

### **Problems Encountered and Resources Required:**

For this purpose, the departments don't require funds. Only important aspect is to modulate the mindset of the teachers and students for 3-R (Reuse, Recycle and Reduce) for sustainability along with the conservation of environment and also space management.

#### **Title of the Practice:**

To serve social wellness through blood donation

### **Objectives of the Practice:**

The main objectives of this practice are as under:

1. To promote blood donation awareness among students and college staff.

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- 2. To promote blood donation by college students and staff in emergency so as to save the life of needy persons.
- 3. To motivate the students to serve for society welfare and value of life.

#### **Context:**

As per the census 2011, the population density of district Surajpur is 283 persons/sq.km. The literacy rate is 60.95% and the sex ratio corresponds to 980 females per 1000 males. The area is predominated with anemic females as per the survey. The college campus is situated in semi-urban area and the students of the college belong to a rural background. The college has National Service Scheme (NSS) and Red Ribbon Club units for social welfare. The Surajpur district headquarter has a district hospital with a blood bank unit. Most of the patients come to the hospital from adjoining villages having BPL card for their medical treatment. Due to low literacy level in villages, there is almost least awareness for blood donation. The economic background of the inhabitants is very low so they are unable to get proper treatment from private hospitals. 'Rakt Dan Maha Dan (Blood Donation is the Greatest donation)" is the quotation and motto of the college to serve the persons in need. The college Red Ribbon Club works with CGSACS and NACO for HIV awareness and blood donation.

#### The Practice:

During the admission of newly registered students, all the departments gather information of the student's blood group in the admission register which helps for scrutiny of student's blood group at the time of emergency blood need to hospitalized patients. There is no discrimination about caste, sex, religion and society for blood donation by the college unit. The blood donation is carried out through the Red Ribbon Club of the college. Whenever any person in need of blood consults any staff of the college staff for emergency blood requirement, the particular staff consults immediately to the co-coordinator of the Red Ribbon Club unit of the college, who informs the concerned student for blood donation immediately as per the requirement. The concerned student goes to the blood bank of district hospital and other hospitals immediately for blood donation. The District Government Hospital, Surajpur has a collaborative arrangement with our college for need based blood donation. In other words, whenever the said hospital needs blood for needy patients, our students donate blood and save precious human life. In this way college administration promotes blood donation awareness among the students and saves many lives.

#### **Evidence of Success:**

Students become very delighted to help an unknown person during an emergency situation. They are also motivated for such activities by awarding appreciation certificate by the hospital administration. The college faculty members, other students and family members of the blood receiver appreciate and accord humble gratitude to the student and college staff for their collective efforts to save an unknown person. The students are emotionally attached to the people whom they rendered help during emergency needs. The above prospects inculcate a positive temperament among the students to enhance their vision about the value of life and the importance of blood donation which saves the lives of several needy peoples.

### **Problems Encountered and Resources Required:**

For this purpose, the college doesn't require any funds. The need of the hour is to modulate the mindset of

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the college students and staff for blood donation to save the life of known and unknown needy ones and their value of life.

#### **Response:**

The college is situated in a semi-urban area with a green campus. Most of the admitted students are from village and tribal background. The main aim of the college is to make the students ideal and knowledgeable citizen through value added and quality education. The college has a large campus with 26.112 acres of land. This co-ed college is the leading college of Surajpur district. The college runs six UG, seven PG, one PG Diploma and one Diploma courses. Chemistry, Botany, Hindi, Sociology, Political science, Economics and Commerce departments are recognized as Research Centre of the university. The college creates necessary infrastructure systematically and continuously with the needs of future vision as per the requirements. The college has an adequate number of classrooms, staff rooms, girl's common rooms, separate girls, boys and staff toilets, drinking water, conference hall, smart class rooms, library, reading room. The college has special facilities like Day care child room, Student help desk, First-Aid, Divyangjan suitable pathways, toilets, wheelchair, crutch and sanitary pad distribution for girls in the campus. To cater to excellent academic needs for the budding scholars and researchers, the college gives priority in providing better infrastructural facilities with well-equipped laboratories, departmental library, departmental reading room facilities. The college has various laboratories for UG and PG students in different subjects like 01 Physics, 02 Chemistry, 01 Botany, 01 Zoology and 01 Computer science laboratories. For the all-round development of the students, the college has indoor and outdoor sports facilities, sports ground, indoor and outdoor gym and large stadium. There are nine permanent faculty members and five among them are Ph.D. degree holders. The college follows the rules and regulations of Higher Education Department (HED), Government of Chhattisgarh, Raipur and affiliating university i.e. Sant Gahira Guru Vishwavidyalaya, Ambikapur (C.G). The principal is supreme head of the college for administrative and academic activities. For quality education, college teaching members prepare academic calendars as per the HED, Raipur guideline and the respective teaching faculty prepare daily dairy reports for academic progress. The academic session is conducted as per the rules and regulations of HED, Raipur and Affiliating university. To achieve the overall development of students the college also organize cocurricular activities along with academic activities. Teachers give his/her maximum effort to solve all queries of the students and also provide their personal notes, books and sometimes pay admission fees of needy students to help them enrich their resources. The College library and Post Graduate departmental libraries provide reference books and journals to students and teachers. The college library is partially automated which uses an integrated library Management System Known as Koha library Software. Offline

UGC-CARE listed journals, E-journals, e-books, Inflibnet, e-PGPathsala and 300 Mbps IsolNet broadband internet connection are available for the students and staff. Many of the students belong to the labour class family and farmer's family as well. That's why the motto of the college is to provide quality education by mobilizing the available resources so that the students are able to get employment. Students also avail the facilities like ICT tools, Career guidance and Placement cell, Women Harassment cell, Anti-ragging cell, National service scheme (NSS), extra classes for slow learners and several skill Development programmes. The college maintains a good academic atmosphere in teaching, learning and education. Students get directly connected with society through NSS and Red Cross Society units of our college which tries its level best to accomplish better personality development, character building of the student so that the student becomes a responsible citizen and better human resource. Every year in each national event the college family makes plantation programme in the College to make our Campus Green and Environment friendly. College NSS units conduct SVEEP activities for the awareness of the voters and Swachh Bharat Abhiyan to make the campus eco-friendly and hygienic. For developing gender equality in the college, the Gender sensitization, Women harassment cell, IQAC cell and Legal Aid cell organizes several activities like counselling of both genders, webinars, Rangoli, Mehndi competitions etc. in which both boys and girls participate with enthusiasm. These efforts made by our institution help students to join them with entrepreneurship/business activities and help us to eradicate the inequality among men and women. To promote the students towards research, scientific skills, learning ability and boost self-confidence on work, the college PG departments focus on trainings, exposure and excursion of students to nearby research laboratories like Water Treatment Plant, SECL, Bishrampur, Soil Testing Centre, Ambikapur, CIPET, Korba, Mushroom Production Centre, Tilsiwan, District and Block Hospitals, Fisheries, Sericulture centers, Surajpur (C.G) and visit villages for study of livelihood project research under Social outreach and skill development. Other than these, all faculties motivate their students to attain national and international seminars, workshops, conferences and short-term training.

The college has been continuously sending proposals for starting new courses and increasing the number of teaching and non-teaching staff.
